We ended the calendar year with a "bang." The AM class' service project, Operation Cocoa, brought in a whopping \$434, which we promptly sent off to the Heartland Animal Shelter in Northbrook, IL. The PM class made a generous donation of \$219.12 to the Make-a-Wish Foundation through their Project Caroling/Penny Wars fundraiser. I am immensely proud

of your kids' willingness to volunteer their time and money for these worthy causes. I think Charles Dickens would have been proud of our dedication to helping those in need.

Speaking of Dickens, one of our goals when finishing *A Christmas Carol* was analyzing the **craft and structure** of the final stave (chapter). After deciding the most prevalent mood in it was happiness, we analyzed Dickens' choices in creating that mood. We compared his choices to three other renditions of the story (two movie versions



and the production we saw at the Goodman Theatre) then discussed which version conveyed the most happiness and which was truest to Dickens' original work. This activity was based off Common Core ELA standards 8.4-8.6. Analyzing craft and structure is new for many students, so it is something we will continue working on this year.

Invention Checklist

Make sure you are logging/photographing/recording your progress on your inventor's log!

Invention

- Purchase materials.
- Construct your prototype.
- Tweak and finalize your invention.
- Apply for a patent.

Marketing

- Create a clever, appropriate name for your product.
- Create a catchy slogan for your product that sums up, in a few words, the gist of what it does.
- Create a print ad for your product. It should include: product name, slogan, and image.
- Print a color copy of it on your own or send a PDF of it to Mrs. Hahn so she can print it.

Commercial

- Write script. Remember to include the product's name and slogan. Underline the claim.
- Film commercial. Remember to save footage to Google Drive.
- Edit commercial.
- Import appropriate background music.
- Finalize commercial.
- Export commercial to Quicktime.

Report

- Follow guidelines to write report.
- Print report.
- Self-edit report (dot-to-dot).
- Include a formal heading (use *Frederick Douglass* paper as an example) and a title.
- Revise and print report.

Booklet (In-class)

- Print all papers associated with your invention.
- Assemble, in chronological order (oldest on the top, newest on bottom), your papers, with your print ad as the cover page.
- Bind your papers into a booklet.

Presentation

• Practice your presentation. Remember that it must be <u>informative</u>, <u>clear</u>, <u>and</u> <u>engaging!</u>
