They believed that if your body looked good when you were living, that's how you would look in the afterlife. For a fun, hands-on project, Mrs. Ferguson's social studies classes are mummifying a real, but raw, chicken!

"We're basically trying to follow the exact steps on what the ancient Egyptians did with our Chickens," says Mrs. Ferguson. "So we got two raw chickens- actually they're cornish game hensand we're salting them. We're on about day 25 and every ten days, you have to put new salt and baking soda in the bag with the chickens because we're basically trying to dry them out."

After forty days, they're planning to wrap the chickens in linen just like how the Egyptians would wrap their mummies. Some students want to bury it but they're not sure how the school would react if they saw a giant hole in the middle of the schoolground!

"I'm hoping they can see how the ancient Egyptians lived. We're trying to go back and have them see how it was really like in ancient Egypt" she continued. The class will also be taking a field trip in April to the Field Museum in Chicago to see the mummies there!

Egypt's mummifying ritual has always been a very interesting study and the sarcophaguses found have definitely attracted us! For the most part, Mrs. Ferguson and the class's chickens have been evolving well so we hope that replicating the ancient tradition can bring about a fun learning experience!
